

**Forum:** North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO)

**Question of:** “Determining the role of the United States in the future of NATO.”

**Main submitter:** Belarus

**Co-submitters:** China, Kyrgyzstan, United States of America, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Poland, Serbia, Tajikistan, Slovenia, Spain, Latvia, DPR Korea, Azerbaijan, Syria, Philippines, Turkmenistan

1. Calls upon all member states to fulfill their commitments to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) in ways such as, but not limited to:
  - a. Encouraging a minimum contribution of two percent of their GDP as called for by NATO,
  - b. Calls for a meeting in the case a member state does not meet two-percent guideline by 2040, resulting in the suspension of a vote until aforementioned member state pays their fee;
  
2. Stresses the need for self-determination and sovereignty:
  - a. All member states have the right to determine their own futures without any external interference,
  - b. The decision regarding American membership is to be determined by the American President, the will of the American people and the United States Congress;
  
3. Urges the formation of a China-NATO-Russia Council to promote co-operation and ensure sovereignty between nations, in ways such as but not limited to:
  - a. Calls for yearly summits in order to ensure international political and economic stability and collaboration between nations,
  - b. Enables any state to call for an emergency meeting in the case of a national or international crisis in order to prevent military action,
  - c. Encourages collaboration between all participating member states;

4. Suggests the obligatory contribution of departing members in ways such as but not limited to:
  - a. Donation equivalent to the fee of the least paying member state,
  - b. Encourages further military support for NATO member states for the following six months after their departure;
  
5. Encourages interdependence and communication between non-state actors, in ways such as but not limited to:
  - a. Increased dialogue between governments,
  - b. Promotion of economic co-operation;
  
6. Urges the US and Russia to renew dialogue regarding the reduction of nuclear weapons;
  
7. Recognizes the importance for the US and Russia to sign the INF Treaty in order to reduce the nuclear threat;
  
8. Demands the acceptance of all points of view in NATO discussions.
